# **Silvopasturing in the Finger Lakes**

New research is showing that with the right techniques, you can intermingle sustainable livestock farming and forestry, using "silvopasturing" practices.

**Silvopasturing** is a planned combination of high-value timber, high-quality forage, and highly-efficient livestock enterprises on the same piece of land. It also includes techniques to establish timber in existing pastures to enhance pasture resources.

This Cornell Cooperative Extension program will be an in-depth introduction to silvopasturing. It will explain how a farmer or rural landowner can put these practices to use to achieve income and farming goals, particularly on marginal or hilly land. The idea is to improve long-term woodlot and pasture areas while earning short-term income from beef cattle, goats, sheep, and other livestock.
